HS-REL-HIS.APO.04.00.0	Apostolic Fathers were known by the apostles or their successors.

HS-REL-HIS.APO.08.00.0	Mendicant Orders were traveling clergy who shared the faith through poverty and simple life; popularized nativity scene, stations of the cross, and Eucharistic adoration.

HS-REL-HIS.APO.11.00.0	Martin Luther posted 95 theses to the door of Wittenberg Church and also taught the ideas of sola scriptura and sola fide.
HS-REL-HIS.APO.12.00.0	Henry VIII formed the Church of England when the Pope would not allow him to divorce; Thomas More, Chancellor of England, beheaded for not submitting to the divorce.

HS-REL-HIS.APO.14.00.0	The Council of Trent was an ecumenical council called to counteract the protestant reformation and correct abuses within the Church.
