EL3-SS.SS.04.A.a	Define and explain the principles of goods and services, including: scarcity, investment/savings, supply/demand, charitable organizations, community service, tithing, and stewardship.

EL3-SS.SS.04.A.c	Identify and give examples of consumers and producers
