HS-REL-MOR.APO.01.00.0	Morality is the standards by which we judge the use of reason and free will by a human to bring about good or evil.
HS-REL-MOR.APO.02.00.0	Virtue is a good habit that leads us toward God.
HS-REL-MOR.APO.03.00.0	Free will allows for the doing or omitting of actions which have been deemed good or bad by the intellect.
HS-REL-MOR.APO.04.00.0	A “human act” is an act brought about with knowledge and free will and a “act of a human” is done without deliberation.
HS-REL-MOR.APO.05.00.0	Conscience is the part of the intellect by which a person understands his or her own actions to be moral or immoral.
HS-REL-MOR.APO.06.00.0	Law is an ordinance of reason for the common good.
HS-REL-MOR.APO.07.00.0	Object, end, and circumstance are the three components to a moral act.
HS-REL-MOR.APO.08.00.0	Eternal Law is the plan of God that directs everything; Natural Law is the human participation in the Eternal Law.
HS-REL-MOR.APO.09.00.0	Sin is a deliberate thought, word, or deed contrary to the Eternal Law.

HS-REL-MOR.APO.11.00.0	The first three commandments deal with love of God.
HS-REL-MOR.APO.12.00.0	The last seven commandments deal with love of neighbor and ourselves.
